Monthly Air Aware Tip - Ozone Season has Officially Started

It is that time of year again; the weather is getting warmer, the sun is staying out longer, and ozone concentrations are getting higher. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) designates when ozone season starts and ends based on when each region is likely to experience elevated ozone concentrations. Ozone season in Central Texas officially started March 1 and will last until the end of November. Visit our <u>website</u> to learn about ozone pollutions and how it can impact you. Join the Clean Air Ambassador Program!



In February, we had eleven days that had moderate air quality; eight days were moderate due to fine particulate matter (PM2.5) pollution, two days due to Ozone pollution, and one day due to Nitrogen Dioxide pollution. To learn how these pollutants can affect public health and welfare, visit the following links:

Comparing the number of moderate Air Quality Index (AQI) days in February 2016 to February 2017, we saw an increase in moderate days from four days last year to eleven days this year, which represents a 175 percent increase.
